From the Podium

Dear Northview Choir Students and Parents,

On behalf of the choral program at Northview, I would like to welcome you to the 2008-2009 school year. The Northview choirs are among the top high school singing groups in the state and I am looking forward to continuing that tradition of excellence with you. Hopefully our new web-friendly *In-Choirer* format will be easier for you to access whenever you need it. You can find archived issues of the *In-Choirer* and other important information on our website at nvchoir.org.

This year brings back many traditions as well as exciting additions to the Northview choral program. One important change is the split of the former 100-person Symphonic Choir into two different choirs (Symphonic Chamber Choir and Symphonic Choir); both groups offer opportunities for students to receive more specialized instruction as well as a chance to sing challenging music.

Our year kicked off with the Northview Fine Arts Picnic on Thursday, August 21st. The picnic was great fun and a huge success with over 800 students and parents in attendance. Several Northview Quartets performed pieces that they had learned at Harmony Camp the week before. Special thanks to all of the choir, drama, and instrumental boosters who came out to help.

The choirs wrapped up their beginning-of-the-year fundraiser on Friday, September 12th. So far, our students have raised an estimated \$4,500 for the choir program. Bravo!

On October 16th, the Symphonic Choir and the Northview Women's Chorus will participate in a choral exchange workshop with the Southview A Cappella Choir and Women's Chorus. All four groups will work with a special guest clinician during the morning, will perform a concert at 11:30am, and will have a pizza lunch afterwards. Working parents are welcome to come in and listen during their lunch hour.

The third annual Fall Follies concert will take place on Thursday, October 23rd. The 2006 theme was *Broadway Musicals*, last year's theme was *A Tribute to the Beatles*, and I am pleased to announce that this year's theme is *A Night at the Movies*. This concert will feature choral works used in a variety of film genres from Disney Classics to Steven Spielberg war epics. The newly formed Symphonic Chamber Choir, the A Cappella Choir, and the Harmony Road Show will perform at this event. Several soloists and small ensembles will also be featured. We hope to see you there!

Northview's Symphonic Gold Choir is ecstatic to begin an adventure as the latest edition of The Northview Choral Family. The Choir has given an opportunity for both incoming freshman and sophomores to expand their knowledge of choral music and performance in a progressive learning environment. The students have already proven their determination to grow both individually and as a choir. In preparation for the Fall Follies Concert, to be performed with the Harmony Road Show and the A' cappella Choir, the symphonic Gold students are currently working on three arrangements that coincide with the concerts "Movie" theme.

The Nightmare Before Christmas Medley has immediately proven to be an apparent in-class favorite. It focuses on four memorable melodies from the classic Tim Burton animated film.

The choir has also begun work on a moving ballad from the movie, A Walk to Remember called Only Hope.

A combined piece will be performed with all three choirs at the concert. The song, Somewhere Over the Rainbow, is both heartwarming and familiar, but at the same time presents a challenge to the students with its many jazz harmonies.

The class is undeniably "tuning in" on the most important thing; the music. With each section striving to better themselves, and in turn bettering the entire chorus, the horizon is bright for this young group. The choir has all of its "choral engines" set in movement and is on track for success.
